The classrooms and snack room are found on the first floor. Children are responsible for bringing in their own snack.. There are project baskets in each room labeled with the children's names that the parents empty each day.

This is done in a playful manner through patterning, predicting, activities related to the story, sequencing, games, or songs. In addition we introduce math, science and history using literature, song and exploration.
